

How To Use and Enjoy Your **Coleman Fuel Camp Stove** Model 459-499

To Light Main Burner

1. Close auxiliary valve. (Fig. 5)

2. Hold lighted match at edge of main Band-A-Blu® Burner, turn valve knob to light position and light burner.


NOTE: Foreign materials in tank may clog generator gas tip. To clear, rapidly rotate valve knob from Off to Light a few times while holding lighted match at edge of burner. 3. After flame turns blue, turn knob to High.

NOTE: A persistent high orange flame indicates flooding, Close valve knob firmly to Off. Allow flame to burn out and generator to cool. Check for obstructions in fuel and air mixing chamber (Figure 3). Repeat lighting instructions

4. Open pump knob (Fig. 2) and pump additional pressure into tank for proper performance. (See panel #3, steps 3 and 4).

NOTE: Air pressure may be added while stove is burning. Do not remove tank from stove.


5. Close pump knob and adjust valve knob to desired setting.



To Light Auxiliary Burner

1. After the main burner has been lighted, the auxiliary Band-A-Blu® Burner may be used.

2. Hold a lighted match at edge of the auxiliary Band-A-Blu® Burner, open the auxiliary valve located on the end of the stove next to the burner. Light burner.



To Shut Off Burners

1. First, close auxiliary burner by turning auxiliary valve stem to the right.

2. Turn valve knob to light position and let burn for one minute. (Clears generator of heavier fuel.)

3. Turn valve knob firmly to the right to off position to shut off main burner.

NOTE: Small flame will linger on main burner for a few minutes until fuel empties from generator.



To Fill Tank

 Close valve firmly by turning valve wheel to right. (Figure 4)

2. Close pump by turning pump knob mly to the right.

To Pump


1. Valve wheel and fuel cap must be closed firmly.

2. ALWAYS TEST PUMP. With pump knob closed (Figure 2), place thumb over hole in knob and pump. If you feel little or no resistance, remove pump plunger and service the pump leather. (See panel 8)

NOTE: Periodically add 3-4 drops of oil to oil hole in pump cap to keep pump leather soft and pliable. (See panel 8)

3. Open pump knob one complete turn.


4. Place thumb over hole in pump knob and pump at least 35 full strokes. (If tank is not full, more strokes will be required) Close pump knob firmly. Good air pressure will improve performance.



To Install Tank

 Insert generator into large hole on the front of the stove and into mixing chamber above burner.

2. Engage tank hanger brackets into slots on the front of the stove.





The Generator

The generator vaporizes fuel. After extended use, deposits may build up in generator causing the stove to lose efficiency. Replace generator to restore efficiency. NOTE: If a small orange flame develops where the generator

NOTE: If a small orange flame develops where the generator enters the mixing chamber above the main burner, shut off all burners, allow generator to cool, remove tank from stove and use a wrench to tighten the fitting on the end of the generator.

To Replace Generator


1. Remove tank from stove. Take away from open flames (including pilot lights) and other heat sources.

Place tank on level surface, resting at angle shown in Figure 1.
 Slowly loosen fuel cap to release pressure from tank.


4. Grasp generator close to valve body with pliers. Remove generator tube and spring and throw away.

5. Slip new spring and generator tube over needle and tighten to valve body.

Inspect tip end of generator to make sure needle protrudes when valve is closed.



To Pack Stove
The tank and generator assembly go in the left end of the stove as you face it, with the valve wheel fitted in under the rear flange of the case.

Things You Should Know:

- 1. Use only Coleman fuel, or clean, fresh, white gas. NEVER USE FUEL CONTAINING LEAD COMPOUNDS OR LUBRICATING OILS. USE OF LEAD FREE GASOLINE MAY SHORTEN GENERATOR LIFE.
- 2. Carry spare Coleman generator.
- 3. If stove is stored, keep filled with fresh fuel.
- 4. Oil pump leather periodically to keep it soft and pliable.
- 5. If a small orange flame develops where the generator enters the mixing chamber above the main burner, shut off all burners, allow generator to cool, remove tank from stove and use a wrench to tighten the fitting on the end of the generator.
- 6. Before using stove after prolonged storage, inspect mixing chamber for possible obstructions such as a spiders' nest.
