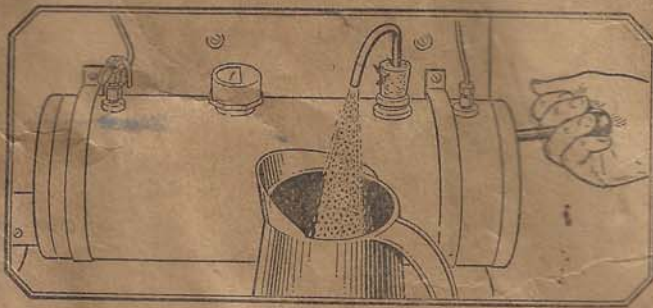


One Gallon Tank Cleaning Tube No. 599.910



For cleaning all one-gallon stove tanks equipped with built-in pumps.

All gasoline contains more or less foreign matter, which will not vaporize, but remains in the tank. If the tank is not cleaned occasionally, sufficient foreign matter and residue will accumulate to cause trouble. A clean tank insures longer service from generators, easier lighting and greater efficiency.

DIRECTIONS

Always clean tank where no damage will result if gasoline is spilled. Keep away from fire while cleaning. If tank is being cleaned inside, be sure to have a receptacle ready as vapor pressure created by inserting the cleaning tube will usually start gasoline flowing instantly.

Remove filler plug and insert end of cleaning tube in filler plug opening until end of tube touches bottom of tank with cork fitting tightly.

Whether or not gasoline has started to flow, use the pump, operating it slowly to create pressure to force out all gasoline. To insure removal of all gasoline, tank must not be tilted.

To be sure all residue has been removed, it is best to rinse tank with a small amount of clean, fresh gasoline and siphon out the second time.
